



St Paul's Catholic Primary School

Pupil Premium Spending for the academic Year
– September 2016 to July 2017

- St Paul's Catholic Primary School receives additional Pupil Premium funding to help to close the attainment gap experienced by pupils from low income and disadvantaged families. The purpose of this additional funding is to raise aspirations, improve progress and increase achievement for these pupils.
- The amount allocated for the 2016/17 financial year is £1,320 per pupil. For any Looked After Children or children who have left local authority care the allocated amount is £1,900 and an additional £300 is allocated for any services children.
- There are currently 21.6% of pupils who are entitled to Pupil Premium which is below the National figure of 25.2%. A very small minority of pupils are Looked After Children.
- **Financial Funding for the Financial Year 2016/2017 = £79,769.23 (including brought forward figure from 2015/16)**
