Week 5 WB 01.02.21

Maths		English	
This week in Maths we are going to learn how to divide. At this stage, division is learnt very practically by sharing and grouping objects. Children will need counters or something to use as counters like pasta, cereal, small toys, play doh etc. to support their learning this week.		This week in English we are beginning a new text, which is revealed at the end of Lesson 1. We learn to ask questions, write different types of sentences and hopefully complete a collaborative activity on Google Classroom to support a piece of writing in Lesson 5.	
1)	<u>WALT- Make equal groups by sharing.</u> In this lesson, we are going to learn how to make equal groups by sharing. This means getting a group of objects and sharing them out one at a time. The tasks are on the slides.	1)	<u>WALT- Ask questions and make predictions.</u> In this lesson, we are introduced to a new text. Look at the pictures of the clues about our new story. You will use the clues to make a prediction then once you see the front cover, you will ask questions about our new book. You can write your questions on the slides.
2)	<u>WALT- Divide by sharing.</u> Today, we will use our knowledge of equal groups made by sharing to look at how this links to the division symbol. This is the first time we have seen the division symbol, so don't worry if you find it tricky! The tasks are on the slides.	2)	<u>WALT- Write simple sentences.</u> This lesson is a revision of writing simple sentences. When we write bigger paragraphs, we sometimes forget where our capital letters and full stops go. Details of the task are on the slides, but I would like child to practise handwriting these sentences if possible.
3)	<u>WALT- Make equal groups by grouping.</u> Sharing is not the only way to divide objects. Another way is grouping, which we will learn about today. This means taking out a set number of objects to make a group at a time, rather than sharing the objects one at a time into groups. The tasks are on the slides.	3)	<u>WALT- Write compound sentences.</u> This lesson is all about conjunctions. Conjunctions are joining words. We join simple sentences together to make a more detailed sentence. Choose whether to add conjunctions to given sentences on the slides or handwrite your own compound sentences.
4)	<u>WALT- Divide by grouping.</u> In today's lesson, we look solving questions with the division symbol by grouping rather than sharing. This is following on from the learning in Lesson 3. The tasks are on the slides.	4)	<u>WALT- Gather ideas for a persuasive letter.</u> In class, we usually do a lot of gathering ideas together. I imagine at home this is one of the more challenging parts of learning as it's only your ideas! Today, we are going to read some more of the story and learn about a dilemma Bear has. We are going to work on a document altogether on Google Classroom, meaning everyone can see each other's ideas! Hopefully this will help us in Lesson 5.
5)	<u>WALT- Divide using arrays.</u> This lesson is all about using arrays to divide. We are familiar with arrays from our multiplication work! We explore the link between multiplication and division today and spot patterns. The tasks are on the slides.	5)	<u>WALT- Write a persuasive letter.</u> Hopefully, Lesson 4 will have generated lots of ideas from you all about reasons for the bear staying and reasons for going. Today, you will choose which side you are on and write a letter to the bear persuading him to listen to you. You can do this on the Google Docs document or handwrite your letter.

If children have books at home, please continue to read as much as possible or use the Oxford Owl website to read books appropriate to your child's book band. I will set a chapter on Purple Mash to read weekly along with some quizzes to test your child's comprehension.		A weekly spelling sheet will be sent out as normal. On Google Classroom, you will find a video modelling handwriting of the spellings for your child to have a go at copying. There will also be some spelling games on Purple Mash available to support your children's reading and spelling.

Science	Topic
