

# **Learning at St Paul's**

**Reception** have been learning all about maps this week. They have looked at treasure maps, town maps, world maps and street maps using google street view. The children have even drawn their own town maps too.

## **Year 4 Multiplication Check**

Your child will be participating in the multiplication tables check in June. The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question.

We encourage the Parents to support their child in continuing to work on TTRS during the holidays.



### **Year 1 Phonics Screening Check**

During the holiday, we ask that you continue to support your child with their reading. Phonics works best when children are given plenty of encouragement and learn to enjoy reading and books. Parents play a very important part in helping with this. Mrs McGowan has shared some resources to help with this at home. Thank you for your support.

The phonics screening check contains 40 words divided into two sections of 20 words. Both sections contain a mixture of real words and pseudo-words. Pseudo-words are words that are phonically decodable but are not actual words with an associated meaning. They are included in the check specifically to assess whether your child can decode a word using their phonics skills. This check will help to identify whether your child needs additional support at this stage, so that they do not fall behind in this vital early reading skill.

### **Reading Stars**

We have continued to promote a love of reading by awarding a half-termly book prize to children who have made good progress with reading during Summer 1. Whether it's diving into a new book, reading regularly at home or sharing their love of stories with others. Congratulations to all of the reading stars this half term.
