New Behaviour & Anti-Bullying Policy

We're pleased to share that we have introduced a new **Behaviour Policy** which is currently undergoing a trial during the Autumn Term. This updated policy is part of our ongoing commitment to creating a calm, respectful, and supportive environment where every child can feel safe, thrive and succeed. The new policy clearly outlines:

- Expectations for positive behaviour in and out of the classroom
- A consistent approach to rewards (Golden Tokens) and consequences (Blue Cards Loss of Breaktime)
- How we support pupils to make good choices
- How we work in partnership with parents and carers when needed

We believe that by working together we can build a culture of mutual respect and high standards that benefit everyone.

New Behaviour Rules Inspired by St Paul

"Love is patient and kind..." - 1 Corinthians 13:4



School Communication - Arbor

Moving forward, all school communication will be circulated through the Arbor App/Parent Portal. We have sent out a number of emails this week so if you haven't yet received them, it may be worth checking your junk/spam folders. New Parents will receive their log in details shortly.

PE lessons & Earrings

For health and safety reasons, children **must not wear earrings during PE lessons**. Earrings should be removed at home on PE days to avoid any risk of injury. If your child has recently had their ears pierced and is unable to

remove the earrings, please inform the school in writing. In such cases, **earrings may be taped** for a short period (maximum of 6 weeks), but full removal will be expected after that time. Thank you for your support in keeping all children safe during physical activity.

Before & After School Club

Many parents requested an on-site before and after school club. We are delighted that this week Progressive Sports have started working in partnership with St Paul's to provide this service. The hours of operation are from 7.45am to 8.45am and 3.15pm to 5.30pm daily. More information can be found by talking to the play workers. The club is based in the classroom directly opposite the main entrance to school. When dropping off or collecting your child you need to knock on the door and someone will come to you.

Attendance & Punctuality

These qualities are not only fundamental to academic success but also essential life skills that are highly valued. Recognising the importance of these attributes, we are committed to fostering and encouraging excellent attendance and punctuality. For pupils who may struggle to meet our high expectations, we will implement effective strategies to support and improve their attendance.

If your child arrives late at school, we kindly ask that you come to the office to sign them in and provide a reason for their late arrival. This process helps us ensure accurate attendance records and allows us to support your child effectively throughout the school day. Thank you for your co-operation in helping us maintain a smooth and organised start to the day for all children.

Mobile Phones/Smart Watches

Our School Policy prohibits children from bringing mobile devices or wearing smartwatches to school. Only in exceptional circumstances will **Year 6** children be allowed to apply for permission to bring a mobile phone. Children who are granted permission must adhere strictly to the policy guidelines. Non-compliance will result in the withdrawal of this permission. We appreciate your support in upholding this policy, which is designed to ensure the safety and focus of all our pupils.

Flu Immunisation

Intrahealth will continue to deliver the school-aged flu vaccination programme in autumn this year. This will be offered to all pupils from Reception to Year 6. This week your child should have brought home a Flu Immunisation Consent Form. Please complete and return this form to school no later than Friday 19th September.

Before and After School Clubs


