## Personal and Social Developmen

I can identify feelings using words like happy, sad, angry I can follow rules and don't always need adult support. I am more confident in new social situations and with new people and visitors to my setting.
I can carry out small tasks e.g. collect the milk.
I can be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs, e.g. brushing teeth, using the toilet, washing and drying their hands thoroughly.
I can make healthy choices about food, drink, activity and toothbrushing
I can talk with others to resolve conflicts and resolve issues (some support needed)


## Physical Development

I can use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils.
I can decide how to match my movements to the task e.g. run to play chase, crawl through a tunnel, etc.
I can paint/mark make on a large scale.
I can demonstrate good fine motor control when using tools e.g. scissors, threading, etc

I am learning to respect each other and respect adults.


## Communication and Language

Listening Attention and Understanding
I can start to listen to longer stories and join in with familiar or repeating parts e.g. The Jolly Postman.
I can follow instructions with two key words accurately.
I can respond and give my attention when someone speaks to me (using my name helps)
Speaking
I can answer a range of questions. I am starting to understand 'why?' in terms of investigations etc
I can respond appropriately when I am spoken to e.g. asked a direct question.
I know to try and listen when someone else is speaking e.g. visitors to my setting.
I can use some new vocabulary e.g. scientific and story vocabulary.
I can develop my sentences using new vocabulary linked to maths or science e.g. I have more milk.
I know many rhymes and can talk about them and other stories I know using sentences of four or more words.

## Literacy

Reading
I can spot and match rhymes. I can begin to suggest rhymes count or clap syllables in a word.
I am beginning to spot words with the same initial sound. I am starting to use different vocabulary from books in my play and when talking about stories.
Writing
I can use some of my print and letter knowledge in my early writing. For example: writing a list of The Jolly Postman's people to deliver letters to, write a note for the Doctor make a train ticket.

I can write some or all of my name, I am beginning to form some letters correctly.

## Mathematics

## Number

I can see 3 in different ways (through different manipulatives e.g. 3 sticks as a row/ triangle/ on top of each other) and recognise it without counting.

Expressive Arts and Design
I can create closed shapes with continuous lines, and begin to use these shapes to represent objects.
I can draw with increasing complexity and detail, such as
representing a face with a circle and including details.
I can use self- chosen materials to create my own ideas to create a model for emergency vehicles.


I can sing my own created songs and follow pitch, melody and tone.
I can play musical instruments with greater control and purpose I can create more complex small world set ups to adapt and create stories e.g. create a town with a police station, train station, hospital and school
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I can say one number name for each item
I can show 'finger' numbers to 5
I know that the last number reached tells me how many I can experiment with symbols and marks (and numerals) I can recite numbers past 5.
I can make comparisons between quantities.


Shape and Pattern
I can extend a pattern that has been made I can create my own simple patterns (ABAB) I can combine shapes to make new ones e.g. a bicycle, a hospital, an emergency vehicle.
I can give simple directions using position words e.g. be a police officer and tell someone where to go if they're lost.
